The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Stonum with motion by Commissioner Metcalf and seconded by Commissioner Beville. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States was recited; followed by a moment of silent prayer.

Introductions were made for our visitors: Mayor, Commissioners, Treasurer and City Clerk

Citizen's Concerns:

- Chris Klein asked that "Non-Sanctuary City" be removed from our Web-site. Commissioner Beville thought that the decision to remove had been made previously and thought the wording had already been removed. There was discussion that METRO Ordinance from 8-17-25 is still in existence. After much discussion (40+ minutes) Commissioner Beville made a motion to have the wording removed from our Home Page on the Web-Site and it was seconded by Commissioner Maupin. Roll Call Vote: Mayor Stonum No, Commissioner Beville Yes, Commissioner Maupin Yes, Commissioner Metcalf Yes, and Commissioner Recendez Yes
- Chris Klein asked about additional yard waste pickups. Commissioner Maupin advised that she has already been in contact with Ecotech about this issue. FYI Ecotech was selected as our new garbage, recycle and yard waste pickup company to save \$30,000 per year.
- Chris Klein was also concerned about snow removal. Commissioner Beville advised we are voting on submitted bids tonight. She was invited to stay for that vote.

Minutes: The September 2025 minutes were brought up for approval. Motion was made by Commissioner Maupin to approve the minutes and seconded by Commissioner Recendez. Vote was unanimous.

Financial Report: The September 2025 Financials had been distributed to the Commission for review and posted on COWH website prior to the City Meeting. Motion to approve was made by Commissioner Beville and seconded by Commissioner Metcalf. Vote was unanimous

Expense Review: The cover sheet of October invoices along with invoice copies were passed around for Commissioners to review and initial. 1 correction of the telephone bill amount to be made. No approval motion was needed since Commissioners had already initialed and approved

Legal

- Snow and Ice Removal contract. Commissioner Beville advised which companies submitted bids.
 - Karrer Construction they made a trip through COWH to see where to put the plowed snow, price per pass, curb-to-curb plowing. Magic Salt - \$10 less per application. Pre-treatment - \$1800.
 - Mow Better owner still be treated after accident. Not yet back to work. Crews not yet created
 - Drury No answer
 - Meiners & Company No new properties
 - Mullins Missed bid deadline

- Mayor Stonum had spoken today with Karrer Construction with a couple concerns. \$725 at 2 inches
 of snow per pass. Price doesn't increase with depth of snow.
- Motion to have Karrer Construction handle our snow removal this year was made by Mayor Stonum and seconded by Commissioner Maupin. Roll Call Vote: Mayor Stonum Yes, Commissioner Beville Yes, Commissioner Metcalf Yes, Commissioner Recendez Yes, and Commissioner Maupin Yes.
- Commissioner Recendez has received landscaping designing bids from 3 companies. Prices ranging from \$2,000 \$8,000. After some discussion, it was decided to advise the companies that the bids have been presented to the commission and will be decided upon at a later time.

Old Business:

- Commissioner Beville gives update on paving grants. This money comes from the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet. On November 1, Legislators will consider which road funds will be awarded. Money would be given out after July 1, 2026. Mayor Stonum is concerned that if we pay paving prior to July 1, 2026, will they still award funds to reimburse us? If we are awarded funds, the amount would be 80% of total up to \$92,000.
- Welcome Ambassador no change/update
- Commissioner Metcalf advised we will be using Channel 9 tonight for radio check.

New Business:

- Commissioner Maupin will ask Ecotech to extend yard waste pickups with having the last one on January 5, 2026 for Christmas trees. Additional costs?
- CD's through Independence Bank
 - They have matured and we are within the 10 day decision-making period. Mayor Stonum, Commissioner
 Metcalf and Treasurer Small will make a trip to the bank on Wednesday November 22 with the decision.
 - Mayor Stonum feels the best decision would be to move both CD's to more 5 month CD's which would mature in March 2026. Also suggested to roll the earned interest into the new CD's. Motion to extend these CD's was made by Commissioner Maupin and seconded by Commissioner Beville. Roll Call Vote: Mayor Stonum – Yes, Commissioner Beville – Yes, Commissioner Maupin – Yes, Commissioner Metcalf – Yes, and Commissioner Recendez – Yes.
- Halloween hours will be 5:00 9:00 pm.
- Open Meeting Open Records and Managing Government Records
 - All Proofs of Receipt have been turned in except for the Ethics Board. Mayor Stonum will get those, scan them and submit to the Attorney General.
- Commissioner Beville has seen many emails not normally received. Mayor Stonum is concerned about AI. Be careful. VC3 is paid by COWH to read the emails' coding and can tell the IP address of senders. Both the Clerk's and Treasurer's PC's are backed up daily. It is OK to trash your junk mail.
